SURVEY METHODOLOGY

Q1-Q51:

These questions were part of the Cato Institute 2024 Trade and Globalization National Survey, which was conducted by the Cato Institute in collaboration with YouGov. YouGov interviewed 2109 respondents between February 22-29, 2024 who were then matched down to a sample of 2000 to produce the final dataset. The respondents were matched to a sampling frame on gender, age, race, and education. The sampling frame is a politically representative "modeled frame" of US adults, based upon the American Community Survey (ACS) public use microdata file, public voter file records, the 2020 Current Population Survey (CPS) Voting and Registration supplements, the 2020 National Election Pool (NEP) exit poll, and the 2020 CES surveys, including demographics and 2020 presidential vote. The matched cases were weighted to the sampling frame using propensity scores. The matched cases and the frame were combined and a logistic regression was estimated for inclusion in the frame. The propensity score function included age, gender, race/ethnicity, years of education, and region. The propensity scores were grouped into deciles of the estimated propensity score in the frame and post-stratified according to these deciles. The weights were then post-stratified on 2020 presidential vote choice as well as a four-way stratification of gender, age (4-categories), race (4-categories), and education (4-categories), to produce the final weight. The margin of error for the survey is +/- 2.54%.

Q52-Q54:

YouGov collected responses April 24, 2024–April 30, 2024 from 2570 Americans 18 years of age and older. These were

then matched into a nationally representative sample of 2000 to produce the final dataset. Results have been weighted to be representative of the national adult sample. The margin of error for the survey is +/- 2.33. This does not include other sources of non-sampling error, such as selection bias in panel participation or response to a particular survey. YouGov conducted the surveys online with its proprietary Web-enabled survey software, using a method called Active Sampling. Restrictions are put in place to ensure that only the people selected and contacted by YouGov are allowed to participate. The respondents in each survey were matched to a sampling frame on gender, age, race, education. The frame was constructed by stratified sampling from the full 2019 American Community Survey 1-year sample with selection within strata by weighted sampling with replacements (using the person weights on the public use file). Each set of matched cases were weighted to its sampling frame using propensity scores. The matched cases and the frame were combined, and a logistic regression was estimated for inclusion in the frame. The propensity score function included age, gender, race/ethnicity, years of education, region, and home ownership. The propensity scores were grouped into deciles of the estimated propensity score in the frame and post-stratified according to these deciles. The weights were then post-stratified on 2020 presidential vote choice as well as a four-way stratification of gender, age (4-categories), race (4-categories), and education (4-categories), to produce the final weight.
